



Bahria University Health Sciences College Islamabad (BUHSCI) has been established in 2024 at Naval Anchorage Islamabad with the induction of highly qualified and experienced faculty. BUHSCI Scholarship Policy has been framed with the objective to assist students with their educational expenses. The University aims to provide equal opportunity for all students to attain their goals/targets regardless of their financial position. Through university funding various scholarship schemes are off red to accommodate and honors eligible students. Following is the type of scholarships being offered by BUHSCI from its own resources.

For MBBS program, merit scholarships shall be awarded on the basis of the result of annual examination except the final professional examination. The award shall be a lump sum amount for the year following the annual examination, as follows:

Beautiful gardens and sports grounds are within the college premises with access given to students for co-curricular activities.




Gym:






Transport:

Teaching, Learning and Assessment:

There will be continuous assessments throughout the year (internal assessment) followed by annual Professional exam. Internal assessment and annual exams will carry 20% and 80% weightage respectively.

RULES & REGULATIONS

Admissions Policy:

Admissions into Bahria University College of Medicine (BUCM) are governed by the rules and regulations of Pakistan Medical and Dental Council (PM&DC). Admissions will be done through National University of Medical Sciences (NUMS). NUMS admissions are based on NUMS MDCAT conducted every year. Admissions in NUMS are centralized and applications are accepted by NUMS.

Eligibility Criteria:

The eligibility criteria for admission into BUCM via NUMS are as follows:

- The applicant must be Pakistani citizen.
- Applicant must have passed NUMS MDCAT. Pass percentage is 55 %.

How to Apply:

Interested applicants can apply on NUMS Medical and Dental College application portal.
