Paper Submission Guidelines for Conference

The following are the paper submission guidelines for the conference.

- The abstract should be between 150–250 words.
- The paper must clearly state the research problem.
- A detailed method section should be included.
- The results of the study should be presented clearly and systematically.
- The paper should include a well-structured discussion.
- The paper should conclude with a concise and meaningful conclusion.
- All sources cited in the paper should be included in the reference list and formatted accurately according to the required citation style, with in-text citations matching the references and only credible, relevant sources being used.
- All submissions must follow the prescribed formatting guidelines.

Paper Submission Sequence Guidelines

The sequence of submissions should follow the sequence mentioned below.

- Title Page
- Abstract
- Introduction
- Method
- Results
- Discussion
- References

Introduction:

The introduction should provide background information on the topic. It should define key concepts and variables. It should review relevant literature briefly. It should establish the rationale for the study. It should clearly lead to the research problem or objectives.

Checklist is mentioned below.

- Background of topic
- Previous research

- Research gap
- Hypothesis

Method:

- The sample size and participant characteristics should be described. The sampling technique should be specified. Inclusion and exclusion criteria should be stated.
- Materials: The tools and instruments used in the study should be listed. Information about reliability and validity should be mentioned where applicable.
- In Procedure the steps of data collection should be described briefly. Ethical considerations such as consent and confidentiality should be included. The method of data analysis should be mentioned.

Results:

- The key findings should be presented clearly.
- Statistical outcomes should be reported where applicable.
- Tables or figures should be used if necessary.
- Interpretation should be avoided in this section.

Discussion:

- Explain the results by clearly interpreting the findings of the study.
- Compare the results with previous studies by relating them to existing research.
- State the implications by highlighting the practical or theoretical importance of the findings.
- Acknowledge the limitations by identifying the weaknesses of the study.

General Formatting

Following guidelines should be applied in overall formatting of document.

- Font: Times New Roman 12 pt (or Calibri 11 / Arial 11)
- Line spacing: Double-spaced
- Margins: 1 inch on all sides
- Alignment: Left aligned
- Paragraph indent: 0.5 inch
- Page number: Top-right corner
- Paper size: A4
