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







Executive Summary

Bahria University since its inception in the year 2000, has emerged as one of the dominant higher education institutions with recognition at national and international level, imparting quality instructions in the disciplines of Engineering, Medicine, IT, Management, Law and Social Sciences. I am quite satisfied that University is providing par excellence quality education and learning environment to the students based on applied research, modern skills, and knowledge.

This report encompasses different scholastic exercises/activities by introducing undergrad and post-grad programs, campus-wise & programs, discipline-wise along-with provision of quality faculty during the year 2020-21. A brief description with respect to graduating students, accomplishments of faculty and students, held during the reporting year are covered in this report.

The university has progressed in research by enhancing linkages at both academic and corporate level. Bahria University has signed 14 MoUs during the period under review. Bahria University has also brought on Board FBR and Tabba Foundation to maintain the linkages with the external organizations. During the period under review, university implemented a framework for promotion of research, innovation, and entrepreneurship. Research and development activities such as research publications, research projects, conferences, workshops & mp; seminars have also been included in the report.

Bahria University is adhering to National Quality Assurance Codes based on HEC's QAA guidance in formulating academic procedures including program design, teaching & Damp; learning, student engagement, assessment, external examination and research. In order to ensure adherence to national standards, BU academic programs are regularly assessed through internal and external periodic reviews. This year, five Post Graduate programs have been launched after getting NOCs from the QAD of HEC. At institutional level mock audit and self-academic audits of almost all undergraduate, MS/MPhil and PhD programs of all campuses were conducted. The report provides information about procedures and corrective measures and initiatives adopted in ensuring quality of education, research and accreditation process in the university.

This year a total of 1022 research publications which include 311 impact factor publications were produced by faculty members and researchers of Bahria University. In addition to that, Bahria University has been successful in getting external research funding for research projects, which is of worth 84.43 million rupees. Moreover, 26 x researchers have been included in the list of AD Scientific Index. It is indeed a moment of pride that our researchers have been included in the list of top 2% researchers of the world, as per a survey conducted by Stanford University, USA. Similarly, the patents which were filed by our faculty members and researchers during last year,

Bahria University proudly announced the approval of our first ever national and international patent during the year 2020-21.

BU is continuously striving for quality enhancement of its programs by increasing international linkages, strengthening foreign collaboration & During last one year, 7 students of Bahria University joined Turkish and Italian Universities under Student's Exchange Program. This year we managed to bring on board, Ulster University, UK, University of Almeria, Spain, University of Malaysia Sarawak (UNIMAS) and The Amsterdam University of Applied Sciences, Netherlands, Faculty of Technology- Maritime. Bahria University has also maintained its standard up to the mark that it has become one of the primary choice of foreign students coming to Pakistan for higher studies. This year, 34 international students from 11 different countries have joined BU apart from the challenges brought by COVID-19.

It is worth mentioning that University offered Advance Merit Scholarship, Financial Assistance and Indigent Scholarship to the deserving students from its own resources. For the current Fiscal Year 2020-21, Bahria University has disbursed scholarships to 2906 students through an allocated budget of Rs. 98.885 Million. Merit scholarship for batch toppers were distributed among 1450 students amounting Rs. 49.889 Million. From external resources, BU distributed 588 scholarships of 99.746 Million. Bahria University Medical and Dental College awarded 19 scholarships of 1.48 Million Rupees during the FY 2020-21. The university has established linkages with the industry for Internship and placement of its students. With the increasing academic vistas at Bahria University, the Office of the Student Affairs and Career Services has also geared up to further enhance its role in increasing employability for students of all the disciplines. Job Fair 2020 and 2021 were organized virtually in which more than 100 leading companies from Telecom, FMCG, Services, Manufacturing, NGOs, Banking Sector and other top ranked business organizations were invited to conduct their recruitment drive.

The community support initiatives were launched in collaboration with numerous nonprofit organizations of Pakistan. Bahria University plans for improvement, and commitment to bring constructive change in students' behavior and personality. Under the auspices of SRC (Student Resource Centre) various clubs and societies have been formed to engage students in different co-curricular and extracurricular activities. Bahria University's students achieved remarkable positions in HEC intervarsity sports championships.

The progress made by the Bahria University during the year speaks about a high-level commitment, from all the faculty, officers, staff, students, workforce individuals, organization and particularly the top administration. I firmly believe that Bahria University will keep planning for the betterment of our youth and help them become future pioneers, experts, critical thinkers and managers for affluent Pakistan.



Research & Development

Research, Innovation & Commercialization

Research, Innovation & Commercialization activities serve as the backbone of a nation's economy. It is an established fact that innovation and commercialization, which are the direct outcome of research and development, can catalyze the economic engine of a nation. The innovation in research is germinated in institutions of higher learning, which can ultimately guide the industry. After consolidating and strengthening of its undergraduate programs post graduate programs leading to MS/MPhil & PhD in various disciplines have been started in line with the vision, mission and academic goals approved by the Board of Governors of Bahria University.

Mission

"To provide strategic and operational support to the University's research activities / programs, while playing a central role in facilitating University-Industry Linkages, Intellectual Property Management, Technology Transfer / Licensing and Commercialization of Research"

In pursuit of this mission, Directorate of Research, Innovation & Commercialization (RIC) has taken the responsibility of guaranteeing that all research programs and policies reflect the core values of academic freedom, professional integrity, ethical conduct and full compliance with all legal requirements and operational standards of the university. The aim is to provide strategic and operational support to the University's research activities / programs.

Objectives

The core objectives of ORIC include:

- Establish and maintain a research culture at BU
- Inculcate the spirit of innovation and entrepreneurship among BU researchers, both faculty and students
- Ensure that the research pursued at BU has relevance to the industry, community and society
- Commercialize R&D performed at BU
- Promote industry focused multidisciplinary R&D
- Promote training and education related to entrepreneurship and intellectual property
- Be a catalyst for creation of new industries
- Create job opportunities for BU graduates
- Contribute towards achieving financial sustainability for BU





Following is the brief description of each component of RIC ecosystem

Higher Education Research Committee (HERC)

Higher Education Research Committee (HERC) is the apex body of Bahria University which gives policy guidelines and directions regarding all major research issues of BU.

Faculty Research Committee (FRC)

Faculty Research Committee (FRC) constituted by Registrar and headed by Dean of the Faculty. There shall be maximum of five elective members of the FRC including Director PGP, Director ORIC, and three members from other Higher Education Institutions, and industry with expertise relevant to the candidate's research-work. The main purpose of the committee is to provide the guidelines and directions to the research scholars for their research work, recommend Foreign Evaluators, Internal and External Examiners for Thesis Defense and Viva Voce Examiners for PhD scholars and form Ethical Review Committee (ERC) to look into ethical dimension of research of PhD scholars.

Departmental Research Committee (DRC)

Departmental Research Committee (DRC) constituted by Dean of the Faculty and headed by the Head of Department (HOD). PGP Coordinator acts as the Secretary of the DRC. The major purposes of the DRC are to appoint Principal Supervisor(s)/Co-Supervisor(s) for MS/MPhil programs, propose Supervisor(s) to FRC for PhD scholars and conduct/manage research proposal/theses defense through the PGP Coordinator.

Research Groups

Research Groups have been formed at the constituent units of Bahria University. Members of each research groups are not only from the same department but also intra-department or from some other research institutions/organizations nationally and internationally. The major objective for the formulations of the Research Groups at BU is to encourage faculty members/researchers to conduct research activities collectively.

Bahria Innovation Centre (BIC)

Bahria Innovation Center aims to provide all-inclusive support and facilities to all its components for a state-of-the-art center to foster networking for its startups, SME's and Commercial Research/spinoffs, different components of BIC are:

Maker Space

The Maker space provides all students with the opportunity to access state of the art electronic test equipment and instrumentation. With dedicated hardware and software space, the lab helps and encourages student researchers to work on supplemental learning projects.

Startup Factory

The center provide workplace, virtual incubation services, training, HR support, technology support, access to finance and help startups growth to form sustainable companies and products. The efforts of Incubation Center at BU Islamabad has been duly recognized twice by World Bank in its independent annual report as the top 3 University Incubators in the Pakistan.

Accelerator Space

Business Accelerator Program offers a 6-months tailor-made program for later-stage startups looking to go beyond the development of their product by scaling their business. They provide the support and resources necessary to building a sustainable company and scaling up every aspect of the business.

Industry - Liaison Office

Our top priority is to nurture long-term relationships with our startups and partners that generate long-term value for all involved. Special liaison offices have been allocated for Industrial Partners/Stakeholders. The aim of creation of the ILO's is to foster synergies between industry and academic stakeholders (Students, Researchers, Entrepreneurs).

Research Centers

Research Centers are an integral part of the BIC. The centers aim to provide, and advocate practice-oriented research and education focused on indigenous and housed researches. By establishing research centers of pure excellence backed by vision and professionalism, the Bahria University aims to solve various difficult problems faced by modern society and to fulfill its obligations to the future of our motherland and humanity.



Training & Capacity Building Space

Assigned by dedicated state of the art training and consulting space, TDLC has been working on improving and further enhancing skill sets via initiatives to such as Leadership and Soft skills development Programs, Short courses and tailored designed training, workshops, mentor ship and Professional counseling for startups, students, faculty and professionals

Technology Innovation Support Centre (TISC)

The sole purpose behind the establishment of Technology Innovation Support Centre (TISC) at BU is to provide support services to BU researchers for patenting their research and development work by proactively coordinating and communicating with BU faculty / students / visiting scholars/ sponsors / stakeholders and researchers.

Corporate Advisory Committees (CACs)






Increasing Trend in the Major Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) of Research at Bahria University


Overall Research Publications

Impact Factor Publications




Inauguration of Final Year Project (FYP) Lab






Summer School



Training on Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by HRDN (Human Resource Development Network)



Faculty Orientation and Training Program Spring



Scholarships

Scholarships are available to students whose resources are determined to be insufficient to pay for the tuition fee and other expenses associated with education. Campuses and Central Scholarship Committees determines the level and composition of financial assistance to be provided to eligible students based on family income and wealth considerations. During FY 2020-21, an amount of Rs. 199 Million has been disbursed among eligible and deserving students under Scholarship head. Sources of these scholarship include BU's dedicated budget and external organizations i.e. Higher Education Commission, Punjab Education Endowment Funds National ICT R & D etc. BU has also managed to disburse an amount of Rs. 5.02 million distributed under Student Study Loan for newly inducted students.

At the time of induction BU offers multiple Advance Merit Scholarship facilitations for the new entrants' i.e. "Advance Merit Scholarship for Board Toppers", for new entrants based on entry test results, "for outstanding performance in CIE's system", "Exemption of Admission fee for BU Alumni (PG Program MBA/MS/MPhil/PhD)" and 50% Tuition Fee Waiver for high academic achievers in MBA/MS/MPhil& PhD Programs".

University also offers various scholarships under need and merit-based categories i.e. Financial Assistance, Qarz e Hasna and Merit Scholarship for batch toppers.

A fully funded Sponsorship program has also been designed for financially constrained students under the name of "BU Sponsor A Student" scheme.



Students Resource Center (SRC)



Covid-19 Awareness to General Public

CSP is honoured to share the news that students residing in locked down areas of Pakistan, provided COVID-19 awareness to the general public. Among which one was a Psychology Student from Psychology department BU who gave awareness session on "Pandemic and Nightmares" and "How to deal with stress in Pandemic"

The unforeseen disruption of coronavirus did impact the nation and its people in numerous forms. To fight such pandemic, awareness amongst locals tended to be prioritized to keep them mindful of the future consequences. Actions in public health, such as social isolation, made people feel disconnected and depressed, which increased stress and anxiety. Nevertheless, apprehension was significant



in order to minimize the spread of COVID-19. Dealing with stress in a healthy way can make you, the people you care for, and your community stronger.

Sessions on Early Childhood Development

Another remarkable achievement of CSP Club is that they involved a representative and a Psychologist from "Moawin Foundation" and conducted an online "Early Childhood Development Program" on zoom meeting application twice a week (still in progress) to educate the students of the importance of ECD and each student is therefore liable to spread the word among the

newly married people around them. 16 students from CSP Club are taken on board for the program. This virtual training program focused on early childhood development (ECD) as it is extremely significant in individual's life and it includes physical, socio-emotional, cognitive, and motor development between the ages of 0-8 years. The session promoted the idea of how parents should be completely ready to take child's responsibility, aspects of early childhood in rural and urban areas, sustenance and mental growth etc. sessions were delivered twice a week and participants were assigned tasks where they were supposed to share posters and other virtual commodities among their contacts and 20 more people to bring alertness in a developing country like Pakistan where such topics are not prioritized or even discussed.

The sole aim of this session was to train their volunteers and accrediting the volunteers with the obligation of guiding 20 more people. Thus, this session initiated the chain of awareness about ECD as it holds significant importance in our life.

CSP's Graphic Designing Soft Skills and Video Editing Course

CSP club, arranged an online session where a free two Month "Graphic designing soft skills & Video Editing course" by highly skilled students of the CLUB was conducted on zoom that catered 25 Club students. This virtual session helped the participants in sharpening their skills and exploring the world of graphic designing as well as themselves. Participants were given tasks after every session which aided their quick learning a lot.

Sapling Plantation by CSP Club on Independence Day

On Independence Day 2020, 80 CSP Club members planted more than 100 Saplings of different species near their homes. They believed that the best way to pay back to the motherland during the pandemic was to help save the environment not for ourselves but for our future generations as well.



CSP's Contribution in Clean and Green Pakistan (1800 Saplings)

CSP's framework (during COVID-19) at BUIC reports that in pursuance of Prime Minister's "Clean and Green Pakistan" Campaign, it has launched a plantation drive in which more than 180 students have planted more than 1800 saplings (distinct species) individually near their homes in-order to cover up 10 mandatory CSP hours.

The Prime Minister of Pakistan, Mr Imran Khan, introduced the Clean & Green Pakistan Movement (CGPM) on 13 October 2018. This national campaign permeates change in behaviour and institutional strengthening while contemplating a need to address five elements: plantation, solid waste management, liquid waste management / sanitation, total hygiene, and safe drinking water.

One of the five components which CSP club immensely focuses on is Plantation as Pakistan has only 5 percent of the forest area as opposed to the internationally established standard of 25 percent. Plantation is included as the central ingredient of the CGPM in order to boost the forest coverage. The growth



in forest area will however contribute in the resurgence of wildlife resources and the bolstering of Pakistan's zoological surveys. The CGPM focuses specifically on empowering people to seek access to essential services, but also on making themselves fairly responsible and accountable for Clean & Green Pakistan.

This is why, CSP club, emphasizes on how trees keep the moisture content in check, and the importance of tree planting in the country is enormous as well as encourages it's students and other volunteers to take part in tree planting by introducing such activities.

Seed Ball Activity at Trail-5 Base Camp

Planting trees and making our environment greener and healthier is vital for our existence. Plants are like our friends; sowing a plant into the ground means spreading the roots of friendship with the environment!

To make our country "Pakistan" more beautiful and greener, "Who is Husain?" A non-profit organization conducted a Seed ball activity in co-ordination with different organizations and universities around Islamabad. CSP club from "Bahria University Islamabad" considered it as its duty towards the society to take part in this event. The event was mainly focused on encouraging people to plant new lives (plants) into this earth. The event was held at trail-5 on the 11th of



All Pakistan Speech Competition






23rd March Poetry Competition




Zoom Live Session on System Security and Data Protection


Meeting with BMC Group






Bahria University Anniversary








BUDGET & FINANCE
